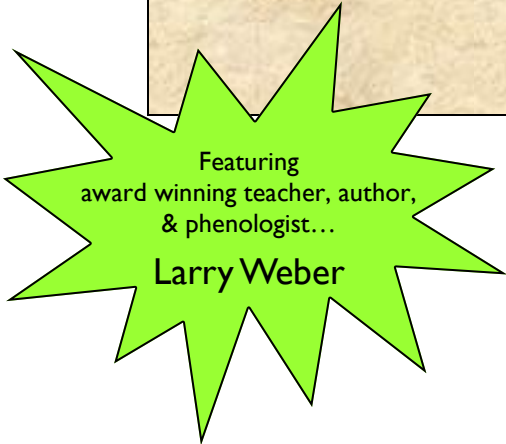




Minnesota Master Naturalist Volunteer Training Program

Master Naturalist Volunteers complete a 40-hour hands-on course with expert instructors and fellow learners. This program allows participants to study natural history, environmental interpretation, and conservation stewardship. The winter to spring transition is a great time of year to see tracks, glacial landforms, trees, spring wildflowers, migrating birds, and more. Final certification comes with the completion of 40 hours of volunteer service.
